WORKSHOP PURPOSE

The purpose of this workshop is to introduce Appreciative Inquiry (AI) as a powerful process for igniting transformative change within organizations and communities. Attention will be given to innovative applications of AI to create sustainable results. Additionally, this workshop will highlight requisite competencies, skills, and complementary approaches that will assist in designing and delivering strengths-based interventions to enhance organizational effectiveness.

WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

1. Gain an understanding of the theoretical foundations and practical applications of AI by experiencing the AI process
2. Enhance skills in crafting appreciative questions, interviewing skills, topic identification, imagining the future, translating the dream into systemic changes, and creating provocative propositions for elements of social architecture and culture
3. Learn how to engage individuals, groups, organizations, and communities in the discovery/enhancement of factors that most dramatically support their success
4. Develop the competencies to apply an AI framework to current and future work
5. Learn how to integrate and leverage complementary approaches—such as dialogue, emotional intelligence, positive psychology, and whole-systems change frameworks
